

## FDM 20P – “FDM2” SERVER ACCOUNT

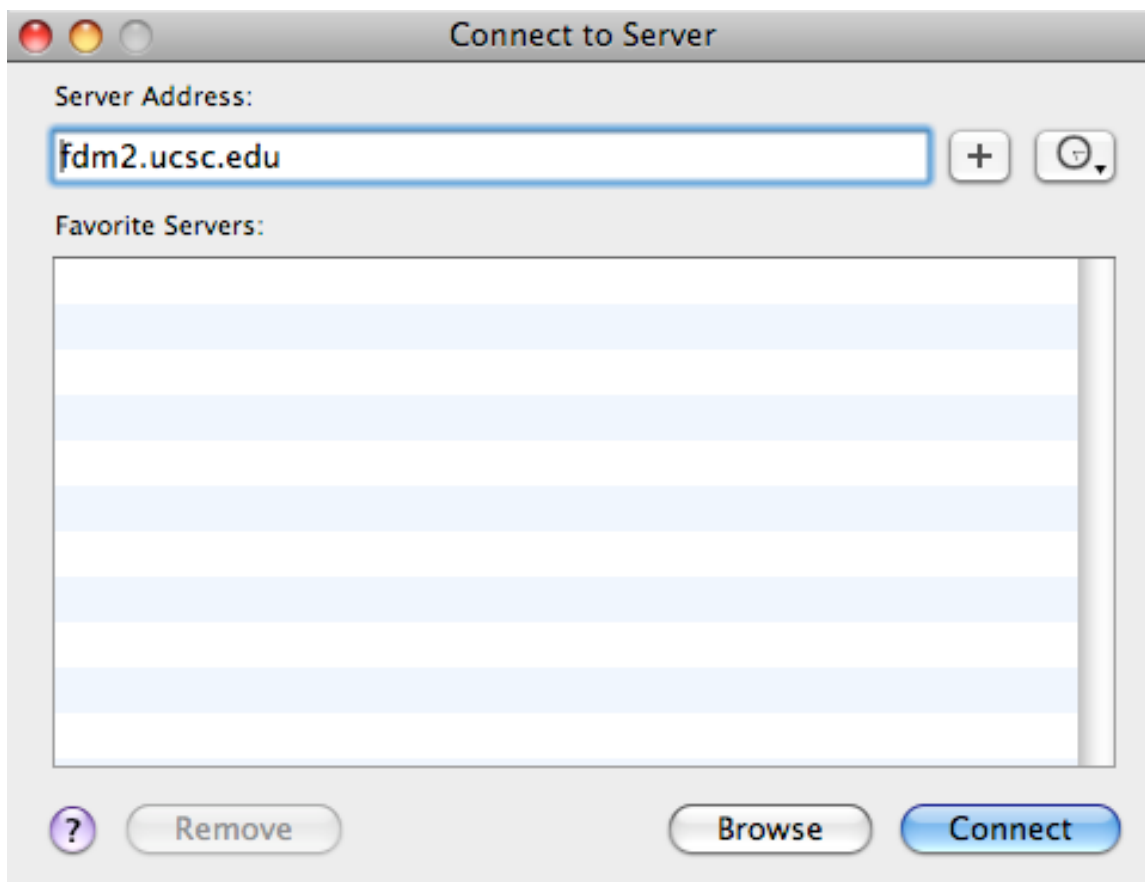
Server Name: fdm2.ucsc.edu  
Login: “CruzMail ID”  
Password: “CruzMail ID + Last 4 digits of your UCSC Student ID #”

### Connecting via a MAC

Under the Finder, click on “Go->Connect to Server...”.

The following window will pop up. In the “Server Address:” field, type in “fdm2.ucsc.edu”.


Click on the “Connect” button.



In the "Name:" field, type in your "CruzMail ID" (all lowercase).

In the "Password:" field, type in your "CruzMail ID + the last 4 digits of your UCSC ID #" (All lowercase, no spaces).

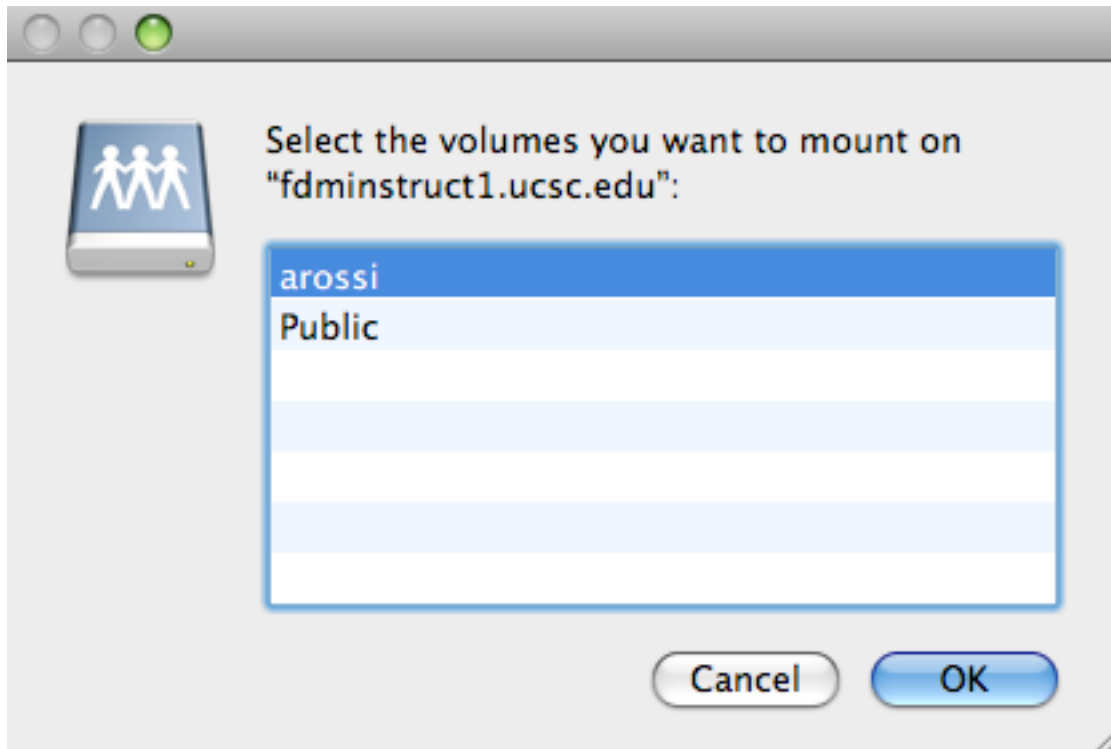
Click on the "Connect" button.



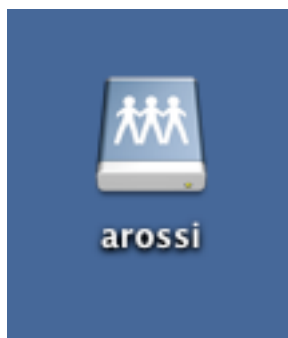

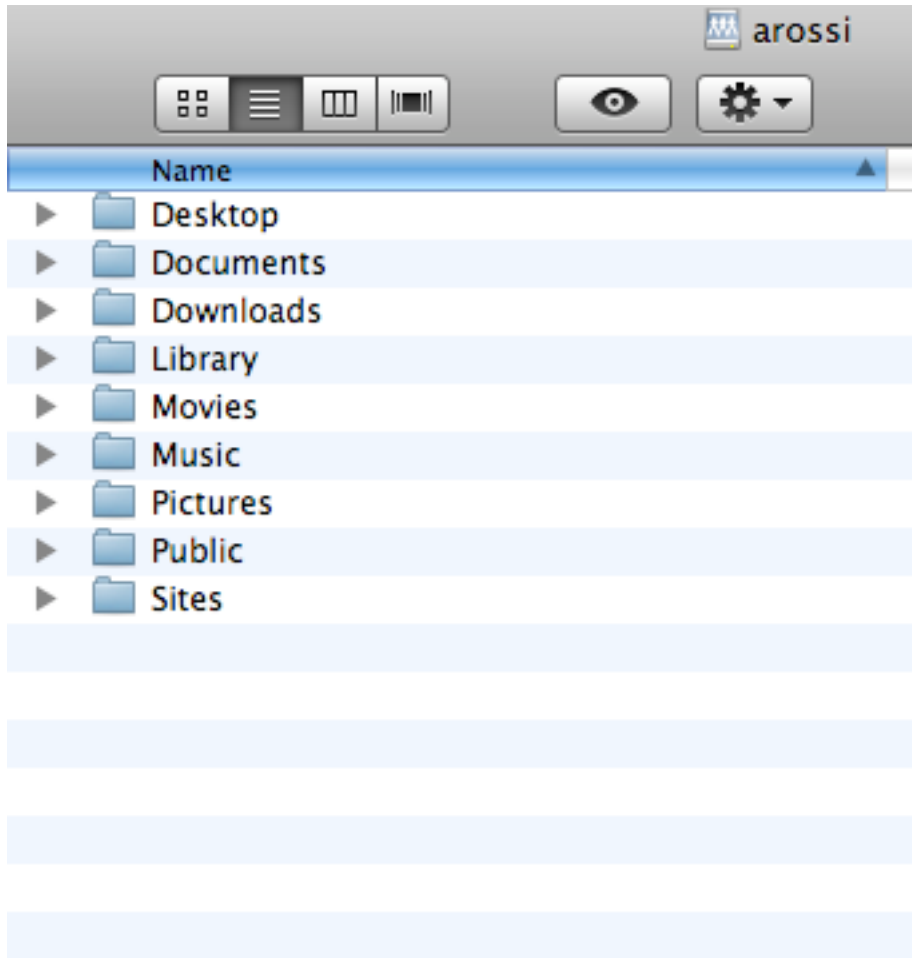
Select your CruzMail ID as the volume that you want to mount.
